

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
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

Note: The Eller College of Management requires Professional Admission (separate application process) to gain entry into the upper-division majors. To be eligible, a student must have a 2.75 GPA (or recalculated transfer GPA, including all attempts of transferrable coursework), pre-requisite courses complete, completion of a professional interview and skills exam. SAT or ACT is not required. Eller offers a "Traditional Cohort" during the daytime in Tucson, and an "Online Cohort" through Arizona Online.

Eller College also now offers a Bachelor of Arts in Economics.
